HYDROGEN BONDING IN SOME 3d HALIDES COMPLEXES WITH FURANNIC OXIMES.

## ملخص:

بينت دراسة الاهتزازات بالأشعة ما تحت الحمراء لمجموعة الهيدروكسيد اختفاء الروابط الهيدروجينية من نوع 0 - Ho.oo في كل المركبات المعقدة المحصل عليها مع 0 - Ho.oo (M5FDH ) و مشتقاتها المعوضة في الموقع 5 بمجموعة ميثيل (FDH ) و مشتقاتها المعوضة في المركبات المعقدة المكونة مع 0 - E5FDH ) و كذلك في المركبات المعقدة المكونة مع 0 - E5FDH ) و مع 0 - E5FAOH و مع 0 - E5FAOH ) و مع  $0 - \text{E5F$ 

<u>Abstract</u>: The ir study of the hydroxyl vibrations shows there is no hydrogen bond 0-H...0 for the whole series of compounds obtained with 2-furfuraldoxime (FDH) and its 5 substituted derivatives : 5-methyl (M5FDH) or 5-ethyl (E5FDH) and with the 3-(2-furyl) 2-propenaldoxime (FAOH) and 3-(5-methyl 2-furyl) 2-propenaldoxime (M5FAOH). On the other hand, the presence of intramolecular hydrogen bonds 0-H...X (X = Cl or Br) is demonstrated in all [ML $_4$ X $_2$ ] complexes and in [ML $_2$ X $_2$ ] compounds when L = FAOH or M5FAOH.

Résumé : L'étude des vibrations infrarouges de l'hydroxyle montre l'absence de liaisons hydrogène du type 0-H ... 0 pour tous les complexes de la 2-furfuraldoxime (FDH) et ses dérivés substitués en 5 par un groupement méthyle (M5FDH) ou éthyle (E5FDH) et à partir de la 3-(2-furyl) prop-2-ène aldoxime (FAOH) et de la 3-(5-méthyl 2-furyl) prop-2-ène aldoxime (M5FAOH). En revanche, il apparaît des liaisons hydrogène intramoléculaires 0-H ... X (X = Cl ou Br) pour tous les complexes du type [ML $_2$ X $_2$ ] (L = FAOH, M5FAOH).

## INTRODUCTION

As a part of our study on the coordinating properties of some furannic aldoximes, we describe here an i.r. study of intramolecular hydrogen bonding in some metallic complexes obtained with the above series of ligands.

5-substituted its (FDH) and 2-Furfuraldoxime derivatives: 5-methyl (M5FDH) and 5-ethyl (E5FDH), 3-(2furyl) 2-propene aldoxime (FAOH) and 3-(5-methyl 2-furyl) 2-propene aldoxime (M5FAOH), whose structures are shown in Figure 1, react with halides  $MX_2$  (M = Mn, Fe, Co, Ni, Cu and Zn ; X = Cl or Br) to give  $[ML_2X_2]$  and  $[ML_4X_2]$  species (L = furannic oxime)(1-7). As these ligands have hydroxyl group, it is possible to consider intra or intermolecular hydrogen bonds. 2-furfuraldoxime complexes, have been widely studied (8) but, as far as we know, there are no earlier publications dealing with the hydrogen bonding in such compounds.

#### MATERIALS AND METHODS

## Syntheses of the complexes :

The complexes were obtained by reacting, in stoichiometric amounts, the oxime and the halide in ethanol or methanol (3-7):  $[\mathrm{ML}_2\mathrm{X}_2]$  complexes are formed when the reaction temperature is about 80 °C and  $[\mathrm{ML}_4\mathrm{X}_2]$  species when operating at c.a. 4°C. The deuterated oximes were prepared by isotopic exchange, using deuterium oxide to recrystallize the crude oxime. The corresponding deuterated complexes were obtained in absolute ethanol at room temperature (7).

## <u>Infrared spectra</u>:

The infrared spectra were recorded with a PE 580 Perkin-Elmer spectrophotometer. The resolution was 2.8 cm $^{-1}$  and the accurate position (± 1 cm $^{-1}$ ) of the bands was obtained via the Perkin-Elmer 580 Data Station. The low temperature (liquid nitrogen) spectra were recorded from a KBr disk, using a Beckmann "RT2" cryostat. In some cases, carbon tetrachloride was used and the spectra were recorded with a variable thickness cell set at 0.6 mm; the spectrum of CCl $_4$  was substracted from the whole spectra by the computer.

#### RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The configuration (E or Z) of the oxime moiety of the ligands was previously determined (2-7) according to Hadzi and Premru (9). When using the synthetic method described by Brady and Goldstein (10), the only FAOH leads to E form, whereas the other oximes give Z form.

As reported in the literature (3, 4, 6), the analysis of the whole i.r. spectra is useful to determine the coordinating atoms in every complex. The main results are :

in the  $[\mathrm{ML}_4\mathrm{X}_2]$  series the monodentate ligand L is bonded through the N atom; in the  $[\mathrm{ML}_2\mathrm{X}_2]$  series (L = FDH, M5FDH or E5FDH), the coordinating atoms are 0-ring and 0-oxime and, finally, in the  $[\mathrm{ML}_2\mathrm{X}_2]$  series (L = FAOH or M5FAOH) the chelation occurs through 0-ring and N atoms. The i.r. and electronic spectra confirm the trans-octahedral geometry for the whole series of complexes.

In order to establish the presence of hydrogen bonds, we have recorded the following two series of spectra :

- in KBr disk at room temperature and at liquid nitrogen temperature for all compounds ;
- in KBr disks and carbon tetrachloride at room temperature for the ligands, the deuterated ligands and their relative cupric complexes.

In most cases, on cooling, a shift or a splitting of the O-H stretching vibration band is observed in presence of intra- or intermolecular hydrogen bonds. Sometimes, this band is broadened as reported by Lippincott et al. (11) and Hadzi and Bratos (12). But this band undergoes no such modifications if there is no hydrogen bonding.

## Low temperature i.r. spectra :

The results given in Table 1 show that in each case, the O-H bending vibration band is affected upon cooling. However, the hydroxyl stretching vibration shows several variations according to the type of complex:

- the  $[\mathrm{ML}_4\mathrm{X}_2]$  species show two bands at liquid nitrogen temperature and one at room temperature;
- the  $[\text{ML}_2\text{X}_2]$  species lead to only one band irrespective of temperature ;

- in the  $[ML_2X_2]$  series, the single band remains at the same wavenumber whatever the conditions, (L = FDH, M5FDH or E5FDH). It is shifted down on cooling when L = FAOH or M5FAOH.

On the basis of these results, we can classify the furannic aldoximes complexes into three groups :

- 1) all  $[ML_4X_2]$  species;
- 2)  $[ML_2X_2]$  complexes with L = FDH, M5FDH, E5FDH
- 3)  $[ML_2X_2]$  complexes with L = FAOH or M5FAOH.

These results lead us to the following conclusions :

- 1) there is no hydrogen bonding in the  $[ML_2X_2]$  series when L = FDH, M5FDH or E5FDH because v(0-H) is not sensitive to cooling;
- 2) hydrogen bonds are present for  $[ML_4X_2]$  complexes and in the  $[ML_2X_2]$  series only when L = FAOH or M5FAOH.

## Spectra of deuterated compounds :

The study of the spectra of deuterated compounds help us to understand the behaviour of the hydroxyl group towards hydrogen bonding. Consequently, these spectra were recorded first with the ligands, and then with cupric chloride complexes. The measurements were made at room temperature which restricts the risks of hydrogen-deuterium exchange. The main data are listed in Table 2.

The wavenumbers of the stretching vibrations v(0-H) and v(0-D) (KBr disks) are very near the known limits for 0-H...0' hydrogen bonds : 3603 and 2654 cm<sup>-1</sup> respectively in hydrated inorganic compounds (11, 12). We recently obtained some single crystals and the X-ray crystallographic study of  $[CoCl_2(FDH)_4]$ ,  $[NiCl_2(FDH)_4]$  and

[CoBr $_2$ (M5FDH) $_4$ ] complexes shows that intramolecular hydrogen bonding occurs through the O-H... X system (X = C1

or Br) and not through the O-H..O moiety (13); the lengths of these bonds (2.998 and 3.003 Å) are similar to those previously described (14).

If we examine the representative metal-halogen stretching vibrations reported in Table 3, we find again the same three groups :

- $[ML_2X_4]$  species : the v(M-Cl) vibration band is shifted to higher wavenumbers on cooling ;
- $[ML_2X_2]$  complexes (L = M5FDH or E5FDH) : the metal-halogen stretching band is not significantly affected;
- $[ML_2X_2]$  complexes (L = FAOH or M5FAOH) : on cooling, the v(M-Cl) vibration band is shifted up.

#### CONCLUSION

On the basis of the present study , the complexes may be classified according to their intramolecular hydrogen bonds :

- hydrogen bonds are present in the  $[ML_4X_2]$  series. As there are not any 0-H...0 bonds, hydrogen bonding is through 0-H...X ;
- in the case of  $[ML_2X_2]$  compounds (L = FDH, M5FDH or E5FDH) there is no hydrogen bonding because the v(0-H) 'vibration bands are not shifted, splitted or broadened at liquid nitrogen temperature.
- finally, in the  $[ML_2X_2]$  complexes (L = FAOH, M5FAOH), there is also the presence of O-H...X hydrogen bonding.

A detailed crystallographic study of these complexes will soon be published (13).
